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Dear Parents,

It really is wonderful to hear the buzz of excitement in the corridors of the school—I am delighted that we are back and pleased that so much of what has been missing in school is able to return. In our staff training days we focused on what should return, reminding ourselves of the great many aspects of normal school life that have not been possible over the last 18 months. Music, competitive sport, concerts, assemblies, clubs and societies, student buddying, educational visits and peer mentoring are all returning in earnest this term.

Some control measures remain in school —the one way system for example—and we regularly remind students of the need to sanitize, to act responsibly and to test twice weekly, logging all <u>results on our website</u> and <u>NHS</u>. Please do remember to notify school immediately in the case of a positive test. Our <u>outbreak management plan</u> is on our website and details our planned response should infection levels rise in school. Thank you for your support in maintaining the routine of testing at home and particularly for your cooperation at the start of term—I was very impressed by students' sensible approach to testing in school. Finally, please do not send your child(ren) to school if they are displaying any possible symptoms of Covid-19 and you may need to extend isolation periods until all symptoms have passed—guidance here.

#### Green Plaque shortlist — Sgt. Pilot Herbert Black RAFVR





Herbert Black is a former Dixie Grammar School student and as far as we are aware he is the only Battle of Britain pilot to be buried in the county. In 2008 Walter Baynes and a fellow Dixie Grammar School Association member Graham Rawlings compiled a complete history of Bert's family background and life. His sacrifice is commemorated in our Remembrance Assemblies in school and his name is displayed in the hall on our Roll of Honour. Walter Baynes and Senior Dixie students lay a wreath on Herbert's grave annually and it would be wonderful to have a former Dixie student commemorated through the Green Plaque scheme. We know that our provision of remote Parents' Evenings was warmly received by parents—equally we understand the value for some of face to face meetings with teachers.
