As I have caught up with individuals following internal, GCSE and A level exams this week I reflected that rarely have I felt more proud of Dixie students. Whilst the COVID nasal swabs and testing kits have been fully relegated to the bins, the return to normal school life is still very much a work in progress, making the calm resilience shown by our Senior School pupils during exam week all the more remarkable. There have of course been, and will continue to be bumps in the road, but the confidence, self-esteem, resilience, mutual support and kindness referred to so widely in our recent <u>inspection report</u> have been much in evidence in recent weeks, and particularly so in the midst of exams.

As some of you will be aware, Mrs Billington has had some time away from school (we look forward to seeing her after half term) and this has given me the chance to spend more time than usual at the Junior School. I have been delighted by and very much appreciated the early morning smiles, enthusiasm and impeccable manners of Junior School pupils (and parents!) as I have covered the 'meet and greet' duty first thing in the day.

We are one, not two schools and exploiting the opportunities of Senior/Junior 3-18 collaboration is an on-going priority for us as a school. As I write, next year's Head Girl Eleanor Bee is getting her black belt in bunting and balloons (under the supervision of 10th Dan Miss Dicksee) as we prepare for our Jubilee Celebrations with pupils, staff, Governors and local residents later this afternoon. Last week she and Mr Mellors accompanied some Year 6 pupils to present to Year 5—to answer thorny questions such as: 'What are lessons like?' and 'How much homework will I get?!'.



Following the visit, Eleanor sent me the following by email:

"The Year 6 pupils did a great job at presenting and I was really impressed with all of them. They did say they were nervous but when presenting they all spoke loudly and with great confidence. The Year 5s were very eager to ask questions and the Year 6s were equally as excited to answer! I think they are really looking forward to moving up in September now the Year 6s have settled some of their nerves."

Much of this half term has been about making preparations—for senior pupils for exams and for us, the big events of next half term and plans for next academic year. The moving up days, induction, science days and bridging courses are all planned and further details have been sent and are included in this newsletter. Following the appointment this week of a new PE teacher in the Senior School— Mr Ben Terry from St. Bartholomew's Church of England Academy, and Mrs Susan Till from Chase Terrace Academy as Head of German, our teaching team is fully in place for next academic year. 

A Level Bridging Course




